

We've put together a few ideas of things you may like to do at home.



Something to build: THE LAZARUS STORY OR A DEN


Something to pray: TEARDROP PRAYERS

HEART-FELT PRAYERS





Read these verses from the Bible that describe how much God loves you.

Draw a heart and tell God how you respond to His love.

Isaiah 49:16 says God loves you so much that He engraved your name on the palm of His hand. Matthew 10:30 says He loves you so much that He knows how many hairs are on your head.

1 Peter 5:7 says to cast all your anxiety on God because he cares for you.

Psalms 56:8 says He loves you so much that He saves your tears in a bottle.

Jeremiah 31:3 says He loves you with an everlasting love

Psalm 86:15 says that God is a compassionate, gracious God who is slow to anger and rich in love and faithfulness.

John 15v13


